The Apple Airport Extreme router and how it can be used in a classroom to moves files from the teacher's computer to the students' iPads.

The Airport Extreme router can support up to 50 users (students) at once. These can be found both new and used in a variety of places online. Here's what you can do to set it up for your classroom.

1. Search for the Apple Airport Utility program and download it to your computer. This can be for either Mac or Windows operating systems.
2. Connect the router to the computer running the Airport Utility and set up the router to create a new network. Make sure to record the IP address you set during the setup process. Once setup, disconnect the router from the computer.
3. In your classroom, plug in the airport extreme router (do not connect the router to the Ethernet cable) and verify that your iPad can see the new wireless "network". Use a USB flash drive to transfer files from your teaching computer to the router.
4. Use a file transfer app like FileBrowser to ease in moving files from the router to the student iPads.

Student Directions:

1. Upon entering the classroom, open up Settings → Wi-Fi and select the correct router (see your teacher for the name of the router)
2. Once connected, use the FileBrowser app (or another app with similar functionality) to connect to your teacher's USB memory stick and bring the correct files into the eNotebook app.
